Bill briefly described procedure of meetings and we reviewed and approved the agenda.

- 2. AGM follow-up: went well on-line, volunteer appreciation acknowledgement was good but we also need to have an in-person event.

Budget and finance – donation to Bon Echo boat fund has been forwarded. Clarification was requested on whether all ACC members receive preferred rate versus Toronto only. Follow-up: all ACC members are charged the same for use of Bon Echo facilities. Crag Care has set up a GoFundMe page on FB, encouraging people to contribution. We agreed to donate \$250, Elfrieda to do this.

-BUDGET / FINANCES: Elfrieda reviewed some of the operational procedures and will forward budget and doc on financial procedures to all Executive Members. She reiterated the importance of adhering to budget guidelines when purchasing gear.

Initial cost of Summer Camp is latest expenditure which will be recovered in May. Other expenditures include sponsoring the Journal to support climbing community, Hike-a-palooza.

- -AWARDS: Bill provided update. T-shirts and gift certificates have been provided in the past. Highlighted awards at National level, where Phong has recently been nominated. Going forward, Executive should keep in mind who could qualify for Section and /or National awards.
- -WEBSITE: Discussion took place on next steps and moving forward. Mike welcomed ideas and provided his own. Much can be done, depending on time and money. Recommendations of FB, Instagram, Constant Contact, Gmail and a centralize IT service so all are connected. Open Source software available for free. All can be connected to our website.

Bill suggested 2 step process – **Mike and Bill to start update content, simplify, and eliminate portions.** Step 2 – direction for future/ going forward, i.e., trip booking software, with leader approval. National is also updating their website and may implement a template for all Sections.

SOCIAL: Pub nights will recommence in April. **Volunteer appreciation night to be scheduled for May or June,** with a possible guest speaker such as Joe Koepek of Calabogie.

-ACCESS LIAISON: Conor provided update on agreement with Montagne d'Argent and action required on fees. ACC per capita rate versus annual rate, \$1.15 per person per year. Currently 470 members by National. Section 400 plus. University student free memberships, should they be included. Budgeted climbing access increased to \$600 x 3 years = \$1800. It was decided to let Anthony of M d'A to know we are interested - long term or year-to-years, whichever he prefers. **Elfrieda to transfer funds.** It was noted that Montagne d'Argent is also for campers, hiking, hut use, etc. Stefan suggested hut reservation for possible ice fest.

Andy Sparks would like to feature influencer to highlight a weekend activity at Calabogie, at his expense, involving ACC-Ottawa.
